## 2017 Henry Fong Award Winner

The Academic Planning Committee selected the following participant in the 2017 INU Student Seminar for Global Citizenship and Peace as the 2017 recipient of the Henry Fong Award.

Isabella Revina Wibowo, an International Relations student at Parahyangyan Catholic University in Indonesia, was an active and thoughtful participant in the summer 2017 International Network of Universities Student Seminar. She believes that the key to building a society based on global citizenship is to put focus on spreading awareness starting with increasing one's self-awareness. She demonstrates in her essay that she learned a great deal about diverse identities and communication through interaction with Student Seminar peers who had different views. She shares her own struggles to understand how global issues affect everyone and believes that all citizens of the world have a duty to help solve these problems.
