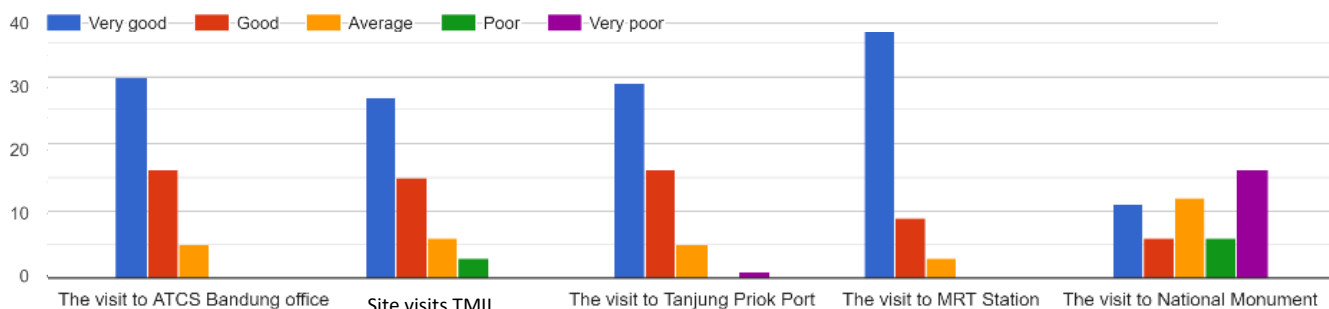
About

International Student Conference 2019 on Global Citizenship (ISC 2019) is an event held by Parahyangan Catholic University (UNPAR) that gathered international students from all over the world in a conference. Conducted in Bandung and Jakarta, this conference under the theme of “*Global Transportation and Mobility: Attempting for a Better Living*” successfully hosted more than 60 participants. Through ISC, all of the participants will gain knowledge through series of lectures and workshops, express their thoughts in discussion, relate their feelings from in site visits, and experience Indonesian culture. The conference’s facilitators ranging from professors, public servants, and practitioners.

In this year’s conference, the participants were brought to relevant sites in Bandung and Jakarta, such as Area Traffic Control System (ATCS) Bandung, Mass Rapid Transportation Jakarta (MRT Jakarta) Project, Logistic Hubs at Tanjung Priok Port, National Monument, and Taman Mini Indonesia Indah to do team building activities in form of Amazing Race. As the final project, the participants were divided into teams to take a role as one of the designated international stakeholders involved in a construction of a city. Negotiations and planning were done to create the best city possible to cater all interests as well as upholding a sustainable way of living.

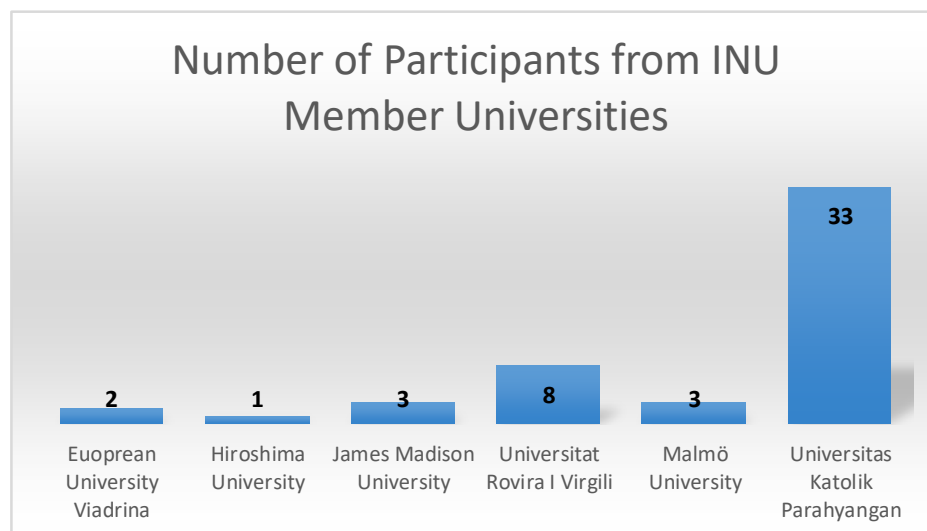


Participants

There are 63 participants enrolled in ISC 2019. Our participants are so diverse as we hosted 20 different nationalities from every continent in the world with age ranging from 18 to 43. Without any limitations on the background of the study, we received undergraduate, master, or

even PhD students from various majors, such as urban and environmental planning, psychology and sociology, culture and literature, economics, business, law, international relations, just to name a few. With 50 of the participants coming from INU Member Universities such as European University Viadrina Frankfurt (Oder), Hiroshima University, James Madison University, Malmo University, Universitat Rovira I Virgili, and our own Parahyangan Catholic University, this conference reflected the cooperation and good relationships shared by UNPAR and the International Network of Universities (INU).

2. Dr. Johan Holmgren from Malmo University talked about “The Application of Technology to Support Comfortable and Efficient Global Mobility”.

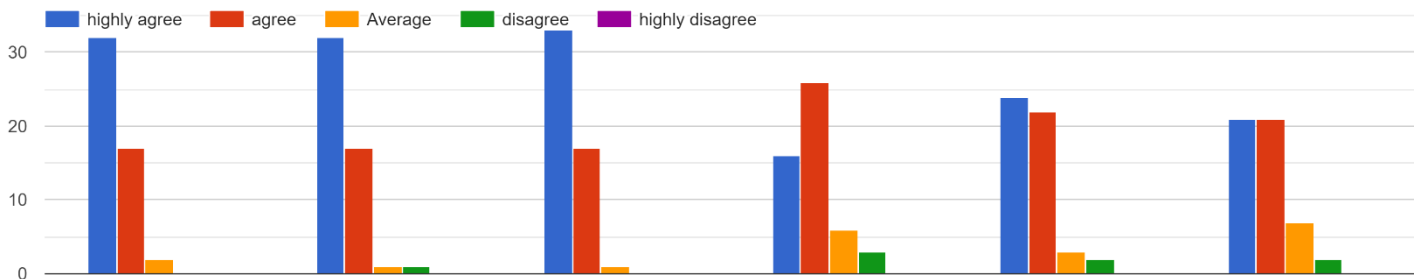
